Carolyn started to volunteer because she felt the courtyards and gardens needed some additional care and she loves nothing more than when staff really notice the changes made. As a Volunteer, Carolyn's best experience is when someone says "thank you".

When asked about the main challenges in the role Carolyn said it is hard when someone may at times undo some of the work she has done, and her best advice would be to listen to others.











Volunteer Update

We are pleased to advise you that we continue to bring back cohorts of volunteers and this month we are inviting our Café Volunteers, if they wish to return to their role. We are excited to have recruited new staff gardening volunteers to help maintain the gardens and courtyards, with an update on our gardens and outdoor spaces detailed on the next page.

We are thrilled to share with you that we have been successful in a bid for funding from NHS Charities Together to support staff and patients wellbeing as we recover from the pandemic. The funding is split across three projects; support for patients with Dementia, staff indoor and outdoor spaces.

The aim of the Dementia project is to offer a virtual visiting offer, enabling patients with Dementia and their friends and family to keep in touch with improved access to inpatient entertainment options. This builds upon the 'Letters from Loved Ones' initiative and will help reduce feelings of isolation. It also provides resilience and a sustainable model for communication, in the event there is another lockdown.

We will be training volunteers and staff to use devices that will be funded from the monies awarded, to facilitate regular face to face and/or telephone contact between patients and the people who are important to them. The volunteers will also be trained to use portable DVD players to help patients watch films/TV series they are familiar with, to improve memory and cognition. New

iPads/tablets/portable DVD players will be purchased for volunteers and staff to have readily available.

Volunteers will also undertake daily well-being walks across the hospital site, which will provide patients time away from the wards. The walks will be patient led and a volunteer will take patients to the upgraded outdoor areas where they can chat, have a drink and the volunteer can read to/with the patient, or support with puzzle books.

Finally a massive congratulations to Sue Roberts, who has been awarded the National Volunteer Certificate by undertaking a number of core skills, learning modules and more than 60 hours of volunteering. She is the first volunteer in the Trust to have received this award. The Team are hoping more volunteers are presented with this award in the near future.



Marv Walk and Talk Volunteer

The West Riding Masonic Charities Limited have very kindly awarded HHCC two fantastic grants. This kind generosity from the local Freemasons will make a huge positive difference to staff, service users, patients and their families at HDFT.



£6,000 for Harrogate District Hospital and Ripon Community Hospital

We were very pleased to hear we were successful with our application to fund items to enhance staff areas at Harrogate District Hospital and Ripon Community Hospital. Staff areas at both Hospitals will be enhanced by having new and a greater variety of facilities available to use. This includes new microwaves, fridges, coffee machines and smart speakers to enhance the quality of breaks for our NHS Heroes.











£3,650 for Dementia Patients

We have also received this fantastic grant to support our Dementia patients. This funding will enable the HHCC and Volunteer Team to fund Dementia Memory Boxes. Each box includes tangible items to help engage memories of the past and present, to help enhance patients and service users quality of life. This funding will also enable the purchase of DVD Players and DVDs for our Dementia patients to use during their stay at hospital, to keep them company and occupied, as well as enhance memory stimulation.

Enhancing our Outdoor Spaces

Our fantastic volunteers have been extremely busy enhancing the garden and courtyard areas at Harrogate District Hospital. Each garden has a different name, plants and seating for our staff, patients and visitors to enjoy. The Volunteer Team are always looking to recruit new Volunteer Gardeners, so if this is something you would like to support your local NHS with by gardening for a couple of hours a week, get in touch with the Volunteer Team to find out more.
